

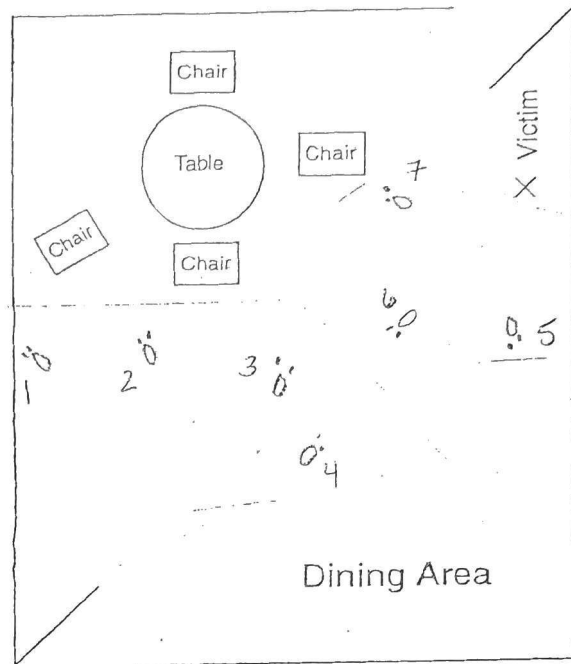
Lab #4: Practical Ex Using Impact Angles + Area of Convergence



DID YOU KNOW?

Crime scene sketches are made at the scene by an investigator and should include accurate dimensions, identifying characteristics such as address or room number, location of fixed and movable objects including victims, if any, location of evidence, compass direction arrows, and the date, time, and name of the individual completing the rough sketch. A qualified draftsman then prepares a final drawing, to scale, for court presentation.
